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ACCREDITATION TEAM INVITES PUBLIC COMMENTS ABOUT MOUNT DORA POLICE DEPARTMENT

Mount Dora, FL (January 27, 2022) – A team of assessors from the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) will examine all aspects of the Mount Dora Police Department policies and procedures, management, operations, and support services beginning, March 22nd, 2022. Mount Dora Police Department has to comply with approximately 250 standards in order to receive an Accredited Status. Many of the standards are critical to life, health and safety issues.

As part of the assessment, agency members and the general public are invited to offer comments to the assessment team. A copy of the standards manual is available on the CFA website at: www.flaccreditation.org, under the Standards Tab.

The Accreditation Program Manager for the Mount Dora Police Department is Jen Renner. Jen has said, “Each of the Assessment Teams are comprised of Law Enforcement Practitioners from similar agencies”.

Once the Commission’s Assessors completes their review of the agency, they then, report back to the Commission, which determines if the agency is to receive an Accredited Status. Mount Dora Police Department’s CFA Accreditation is valid for Three (3) years. Verification by the Commissions Accreditation team is part of a voluntary process to gain or maintain CFA Accreditation.
